



FUN FACT: Tom James

In an official GM new-product press release dated January 16, 1953, the name Corvette is Had the odd spelling spelled Courvette. occurred once, we might chalk it up to a simple typographical error. But the Courvette nomenclature appeared several more times in the same document. Interestingly, 26 years earlier, on January 23, 1927, the General and Colour Section Motors Art established, with creative genius Harley Earl in charge. The British spelling of the word "color" was intentional and added exotic flair. Although officially renamed the General Motors Styling Section in 1937, memorable Art and Colour moniker is still used informally.

The man responsible for naming Corvette was a Chevrolet public relations executive named Myron C. Scott. Despite his significant contribution to automotive history, Mr. Scott wasn't compensated beyond his normal salary. By contrast, over at Ford, division manager L.D. Cruso initiated an in-house name-storming contest which Ford designer Alden Gilberson won when he suggested the name Thunderbird. Initially a new suit worth \$250 was at stake but records show Gilberson accepted \$95 cash and a pair of trousers from Saks Fifth Avenue instead.

My 1957 Corvette Project

This car belonged to Mrs Joyce Nickoson, a very close friend of mine. She was the second owner of the car. She purchased it from a friend of hers in the early 60's. Her husband and her decided to redo the car in 1971.



They pulled it apart removing almost every piece down to frame off . The frame and all components were refurbished or replaced and painted. Completed rolling chassis made new . Body was put back on chassis in prep for paint. Me Nickoson actually built race engines for NASCAR , so in 1971 he went to the Norwood GM plant and purchased a LT1 crate engine , then tore it down and machined and built it to his liking. According to information I have it's dyno is pushing 500hp .



The 4spd Muncie trans has been custom built along with the rear diff. Engine and trans were never put in the car and the paint and

assembly was never completed. This all stopped in the early 70's. The engine remained on the test stand were he ran it in . As time went by they acquired lots of new part to reassemble. FYI these were my neighbors. They were my wife's neighbors all through childhood. Mr Nickoson passed late 90's he collected Corvettes. He had around 10 ranging from 1965 to 1999, the 57 belonged to Joyce. Joyce had a Arabian stallion horse that I helped care for, one day she fell in the barn breaking her leg from the knee down in several places before her husband died, she was in nursing home when he passed, I cared for her for about 2 years to the point of her getting it amputated and passed 2 days later . .All of Bobs cars were sold while she was living. Before passing she had made me a co executor of her Will . Soon after her death I found out she left me her car (The 57).



It took me 2yrs in probate court to actually get it. In the meantime Bob's side of the family had been stealing stuff from the farm and by time I was allowed to collect the car and, whatever I could find of it's disassembled parts, they had gotten away with the grill, bumpers, lights, side trim,

coil, hub caps, clutch , horn button and probably much more . There's much more details to the story I tried to keep it short.



We can talk more if you want to . Oh yeah he also had a like new 1966 GTO 389 tri power 4speed

So as for me owning it , you know I'm disabled with Reflex Sympathetic Dystrophy aka RSD , I spent time with the car trying to inventory what's there and what's not.

I'm capable of the paint and reassembly, but over the last few years life and family has taken front seat to my time but most of all is not having the financing to put towards it.

This is very near and dear to me for she has a special place in my heart as I held her hand until her dying breath. I'd like to get the car back together in her dedication , she loved that car and had told me many stories of her with it in her youth .
