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
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Fun Facts Tom James

It has come to light that between 43 and 47 C4 Corvettes were indeed produced with 1983 VIN tags, some appearing at the 1982 Riverside press preview. At least one of them still exists. It carries VIN sequence number 23 and lives at the National Corvette Museum in Bowling Green, Kentucky. Interestingly, this car was among the Corvettes under the museum's Sky Dome when the infamous February 13, 2014, sinkhole struck. Luckily, 1983 C4 Number 23 escaped serious harm and was soon returned to the museum display fleet. This car is owned by General Motors.

History has proven that General Motors (as with most car makers) is not particularly nostalgic about its past. Sure, it preserves major-league show and concept cars, but considering that the constant process of upgrading next year's model produced hundreds of "mule cars", it would have been impossible to save them all for prosperity. Most were crushed. Rumor is that the fleet of 1983 C4s were scrapped, and their remains buried somewhere inside the former GM Proving Grounds in Mesa, Arizona. C4 Corvette Number 23 only survived thanks to a series of hasty relocations and body-color changes to throw would-be scrappers off its scent until the threat subsided. Today, the Mesa site is privately owned and is being developed into housing units. You have to wonder what bizarre automotive treasures bulldozers have excavated during the process.

New 2024 E-Ray Corvette Announcement



The first-ever electrified and AWD Corvette E-Ray delivers all-season performance and 0-60 mph in 2.5 seconds ...

Exactly 70 years ago to date, on Jan. 17, 1953, Chevrolet unveiled the very first Corvette at Motorama in New York City. Today, Chevrolet introduces the first-ever electrified and AWD Corvette, the 2024 E-Ray.

The E-Ray was developed to be the Corvette owners can arrive in anywhere, no matter the road conditions, thanks to its eAWD capability that ensures all-weather confidence.

E-Ray is the only sports car that pairs naturally aspirated V-8 power with electrified responsiveness, making it "one like none." This allows the E-Ray to clock a 2.5-second 0-60 mph time, making it the quickest production Corvette in history.

The vehicle offers a combined 655 horsepower and 470 lb-ft of torque from the 6.2L LT2 Small Block V-8. The E-Ray's 6.2L LT2 V-8 engine is complemented by an electric motor that provides an additional 125 lb-ft of torque from the front wheels via a 1.9 kWh battery pack located in the structural tunnel between the seats.

Electrified propulsion

The E-Ray's electrified propulsion system can provide limited all-electric propulsion at the driver's discretion upon startup. A standard Active Fuel Management system also helps to reduce fuel consumption.

The amount of electric assist is tailored within each of the Corvette E-Ray's six driver-selectable modes: Tour, Sport, Track, Weather, My Mode and Z-Mode. Drivers can also select the Charge+feature, which maximizes the battery's state of charge.

Additional features and technologies of the all-new E-Ray include:

• Stealth Mode, an electric drive mode for the street

- **New lightweight lithium-ion 12-volt** battery that supports the LT2 V-8 engine's stop/start functionality
- Standard Brembo Carbon Ceramic brake system for optimal braking performance
- **Visceral sound experience** that embodies the car's dominating presence. The electric front motor works in harmony with the LT2 engine to create an invigorating sound
- eAWD system that applies additional power to the front wheels during spirited driving in low traction environments, enhancing vehicle stability
- Regenerative battery charging system means there is no need for plug-in charging. The system is charged mostly via regenerative energy from coasting, braking, and during normal driving

Stealth Mode and tracking the E-Ray

The Corvette E-Ray's two driver-initiated electric modes enable the car to travel under electric propulsion in certain conditions.

Stealth Mode enables all-electric driving, when selected at start-up, for a period of time before the engine turns on for normal driving. It is designed for quietly exiting a neighborhood, with a maximum speed of 45 mph. The engine automatically turns on if the vehicle's speed exceeds the limit, additional torque is requested by the driver, or the E-Ray's battery pack is depleted.

The custom-designed Performance Traction Management (PTM) modes are optimized in concert with the eAWD propulsion system.

Distinguished design

The E-Ray introduces the all-new Artemis Dipped interior, which features complementary deep green tones on nearly every interior surface and will only be available on 2024 Corvettes. Additionally, there are fourteen exterior color choices, including new-for-2024 Riptide Blue, Seawolf and Cacti.

Coming later this year

The 2024 Corvette E-Ray goes on sale in 2023, with an MSRP of \$104,295 for the 1LZ coupe and \$111,295 for the 1LZ convertible model. Production will take place at GM's Bowling Green Assembly facility in Kentucky, from US and globally sourced parts. Go to chevrolet.com for more information.
