

Fun Facts Tom James

If the shark-era Corvette ended with the 1982 model year, what happened in 1983? Nothing. There was no official 1983 Corvette, at least not at your local Chevy dealership. That said, as early as December 1982, several production-equivalent C4 Corvettes were shown to the automotive press at a long-lead preview at California's Riverside Raceway. It is not correct to assume that no tangible efforts were made for the 1983 model run. They just were not released for public sale. Incidentally, Chevrolet was fully aware that 1983 marked the Corvette's 30th anniversary. December 1982 C4 showcase at Riverside included a Polo White 1953 (or possibly 1954) Corvette with its hood open. No doubt, General Motors added this touch of nostalgia to reinforce how very far the Corvette had come in its first three decades.

Nevertheless, the missing 1983 models have triggered much mystery and confusion. When asked why there was no 1983 Corvette, Wes Yokum, Chevrolet Raceshop employee, said "There was a miscommunication between the body designers and chassis designers of the car. At the last minute it was discovered there was a 2-inch discrepancy and there was no time to correct the problem. So, Corvette sat out its 30th anniversary".
